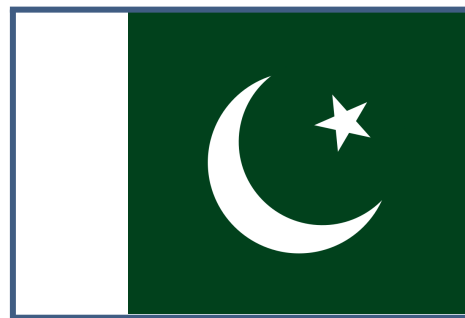

Pakistan recognizes the importance of ensuring post-conflict peace. Pakistan Defense Day is held annually on September 6. After 9/11, Pakistan lost more than 83,000 people and suffered economic damages of more than \$250 billion. The nation was able to completely exterminate terror networks, goon squads, and non-state rogue elements from its borders in a matter of years. One of the biggest nations sending troops to UN "Peacekeeping Missions" abroad in Pakistan. With over 172,000 associates, including 400 women, Pakistan engaged in 43 peacekeeping missions in 26 nations. In Pakistan, June 5 is observed as Peacekeepers Day. We recognize Pakistan's sacrifices on this day for global security and peace. There are tens of thousands of armed police, government, and military personnel prepared to respond to any peacekeeping missions. Pakistan provides leadership and valuable policy contributions for a number of global concerns, including environmental protection and human rights. supporting Pakistan's decision to accept 1.3 million Afghan and a small number of Iranian refugees. In addition to assisting them, this had an impact on Pakistan's rising "Malaria" epidemics. Pakistan hired certain security experts to stop the disease's spread and maintain a secure and peaceful society.
